Pastoral Letter Spring/Summer 2024

A letter from our Minister - Rev David Hood

January is a time when we look back and then forward, wondering what the year ahead will hold for us. Writing this letter in the middle of January for a magazine to be delivered in March, presents a challenge. I have no idea what the world, town, Parish and Church will be like in 2 months time. Huge international tensions, Ukraine and Russia, and military action in the Middle East are the more serious of humanly created issues, and the world is also experiencing more and more major natural events, often affecting huge numbers of people. You may be reading this and thinking, "Well, not much has changed in the last 2 months", but there is a real possibility that you are acutely aware of a particular event or situation in the world which has dominated the media for the last week or two, or more.

Change is the one constant we all face, and that applies to us as individuals - from small changes to the big life altering events which are part of life. Whenever my life is shaken by unwelcome illness, accident or loss, I seek reassurance and strength from the promises contained in the Bible, which declare that nothing can separate us for the love of God, found in Jesus. Elsewhere it says that Jesus is the same yesterday, today and forever. I try to hold on to these declarations as well as the promises of God's presence and love. Christian believers are not exempt, and should not be surprised when challenges and change comes. However, the real challenge is to hold to faith, to trust and follow, to persevere and grasp courage, knowing that we are never left to cope alone by the God of Love.

Looking ahead can also bring the anticipation of joy and celebration. The wedding scheduled for later this year, the birth due to take place, the special birthday or anniversary, or the trip of a lifetime – all of these can create a wonderful excitement as the day or event approaches. I have often described Jesus as a bit of a 'party animal'.

His first miracle was when he was at a wedding and although reluctant, was persuaded by his Mum to help when the wine ran out. He didn't just convert a few gallons, but rather he converted 1440 pints of water into he best quality wine. The wedding party got back on track and the wine would last well after the party had finished. That reminds me of the abundant generosity of our Saviour who loves us.

In the last magazine, I spoke about the new one due to be produced. Ironically we could not foresee some of the change related technical difficulties which have delayed this, and so this issue will be the last magazine in this format.

What does the Presbytery do?

When the Rev Robbie Hamilton, the Presbytery Clerk, preached in Paisley South on Sunday 14^{th} January, I wonder how many asked "What does the Presbytery Clerk do?

Indeed, what does the Presbytery do?" I think everybody is aware that the Church of Scotland has a General Assembly in Edinburgh every year and that it determines the direction for the Church, sometimes after lively debates. So what is the rôle of the Presbytery? First of all, we need to know that Scotland is divided into 39 presbyteries. (There are three other presbyteries furth of Scotland: the Presbytery of England, the Presbytery of Europe and the Presbytery of Jerusalem.) Our congregation is one of those covered by the Presbytery of Clyde (which was created in September 2020 out of the union of Greenock and Paisley Presbytery and Dumbarton Presbytery.) Each presbytery is made up of ministers (one per congregation), elders (one per congregation), deacons, retired ministers and a few additional elders. Paisley South is represented by our minister, the Rev David Hood, and me, as Representative Elder. In addition, the following members of our congregation are members of Presbytery: Liz McFarlan and Sandra Maxwell, as Readers, Russell Banks, as a Reader Emeritus, and Rev David Kay, as a Retired Minister.

So what do we do?

Well, first of all, we worship together, and that helps to create friendship and fellowship among the congregations. Secondly, it should be noted that every Presbyter, whether a minister or an elder, has the speak at meetings and has an equal riaht Sometimes, topics for discussion are sent down to Presbyteries from the General Assembly. A recent example was the Confessions of Faith Overture. The General Assembly had adopted an Overture seeking amendment of the Articles Declaratory of our faith and had asked presbyteries to confirm that they agreed with this. Clyde Presbytery debated the matter at its meeting on 4th November last and concluded by signifying its approval, with 75 votes for and only 2 against. Apart from such matters, which do not arise very often, Presbytery has many other duties. One is to deal with the situation arising when a minister decides to retire or to accept a call to another congregation or also when a minister is ill: in these events Presbytery appoints someone (usually a minister but sometimes an elder with the appropriate training) to act as Interim Moderator, and can sometimes help the Session Clerk in organising a Locum or pulpit supply. Where there is a vacancy, and a new minister has to be found, there is a Committee - the Vacancy Procedure Committee, of which I am the Convener - which deals with the situation by meeting with, first, the Kirk Session, and, then, the Nominating Committee to give advice as to how to go about the task. Presbytery's next duty is to calculate how much each congregation has to contribute each year to the work of the Church and to record how the communal funds are expended. This onerous duty is undertaken by the Presbytery Treasurer, who is currently Ian Steven, father of our own Congregational Treasurer, Derek Steven. There is also a Stewardship & Finance Committee, which examines each congregation's annual accounts. The Ministry Committee oversees the progress of those who are training to become ministers. It also organises training courses for un-ordained people who wish to become Worship Leaders.

The Property Committee arranges the carrying out of the Quinquennial Reports on every congregation's properties. When a congregation wants to spend larger sums of money on repairs or alterations or even to purchase a new manse, it cannot do so until Presbytery gives its approval. A congregation cannot call a new minister until Presbytery has confirmed that the manse is suitable, not only as regards its accommodation and condition but also, nowadays, as regards its energy efficiency. Another important function of Presbytery is to support ministers and congregations and to offer advice as to how each congregation can improve its mission to its parish. The Church is determined to make mission its raison d'être and that's what is behind the recently approved Presbytery Plan: the Church should be concentrated on the number of parishes and buildings which will best enable it to fulfil this mission.

So back to the question: "What does the Presbytery Clerk do?" It's his job to administer and supervise all these functions. It's very much a full-time job.
